Activity

We will clean up the east side of the Whippany River bank, near Community Gardens. The Morristown Sewage Treatment Plant and the Morris County Mall are on the west side of the river at this location. There is a small flood plane on the east bank that collects trash during high water.

Appropriate Outdoor Attire

Shoes that will get muddy and long sleeved shirts, long pants for protection from multi-flora rose. Hacklebarney TU will provide water and trash bags. The Whippany River Watershed Action Committee will provide work gloves.

Directions

Community Gardens is behind the Morristown Sewage Treatment Plant, 80 East Hanover Ave, Cedar Knolls, New Jersey.

From Ridgedale Ave in Morristown/

Cedar Knolls: Traveling either north or south on Ridgedale Ave, turn east on East Hanover Ave. The treatment plant is about two blocks from Ridgedale Ave on the north side. It is on the left before East Hanover Ave crosses over Route 287 and before the Morris County Library. Turn into the plant and follow the road that goes to the right (east) until you reach the gardens area. There is parking in the back.
